The Georgia Hunter Jumper Association is an affiliate member of the United States Hunter Jumper Association. The USHJA operates under the umbrella of the United States Equestrian Federation. The GHJA stands with these national organizations and looks to them for guidance in terms of policy related to the Covid-19 epidemic. It is paramount that we work together as a community to ensure that horse shows remain safe and can continue. It is with that reasoning that the GHJA is following the regulations provided in the USEF Covid-19 Action Plan. Please note that these regulations apply to local shows as well as rated shows. Some of the included rules are as follows:

- Participants and Support Personnel are required to wear a facemask or face covering at all times while on competition grounds when not mounted on a horse.
- All individuals must practice social distancing (or physical distancing) at all times while on the competition grounds by staying at least 6 feet (about 2 arms' length) from any person who is not a member of their immediate household. Members of the same household are still required to wear masks or face coverings at all times while on competition grounds.
- The public, spectators, and non-essential personnel such as guests are prohibited from being on the competition grounds until further notice.
- Participants and Support Personnel are required to self-monitor their temperature once daily prior to entering the competition grounds. Anyone with a temperature of 99.5° F (37.5° C) or higher may not enter the facility.

Failure to comply with these regulations can result in an individual's removal from the show grounds. It is the responsibility of show management to inform participants of the rules and to enforce them. Failure by management to enforce these rules will result in a fine and the potential loss of GHJA sanctioning.

The GHJA is committed to doing everything in its power to ensure the continuation of competition in our sport. It is by following these protocols that we put ourselves in the best position to continue to do what we love. It is all of our responsibility to act in good faith and be respectful of show managers and other participants by adhering to the rules set forth. We will stay steadfast in our commitment to best serve our membership and the equestrian community as a whole.
